

## Celebrating Our Love of Coffee

Did you know that
October 1 is National
Coffee Day? This is a great
time to share the love of coffee
with others and explore the history while
discovering several refreshing drink recipes.

#### The Humble Beginnings

Where did our love for coffee officially begin? There are many versions of the story about its origin, but most historians agree that it can be traced back to the Ethiopian plateau where a goat herder noticed that his goats became so wired after eating the coffee berries that they didn't want to sleep at night. He shared his findings with the local monastery, which resulted in the monks making a drink with the coffee berries that would keep them alert during hours of evening prayers. From there, word began to spread, and it would soon reach the Arabian Peninsula and then continue across the globe.

#### The Global Expansion

According to the National Coffee Association, coffee was being grown in the Yemeni district of Arabia by the 15th century and then known in Persia, Egypt, Syria, and Turkey by the 16th century. Coffee houses became the gathering places in these regions and with thousands of pilgrims visiting the holy city of Mecca each year from all over the world, knowledge of this "wine of Araby" began to spread. Coffee had made its way to Europe and was becoming popular across the continent by the 17th century. Though many believed this new energizing drink was evil, most of the population discovered that it allowed them to be more alert and productive. It would make its way to the United States during the 1700s and would eventually become the official drink of choice after the Boston Tea Party spoiled our love of tea in 1773. The rest is history.
